DEACON'S QUESTION BOX

Why Don't We Hear About Purgatory?

This is a great question but it has no great answer. The period of purification, which we call purgatory, has been part of the teachings and writings of the Church since the early Fathers of the Church. It was formally defined at the Council of Florence in the 1400's.

We have gone through a period in US Church history where much of the guidance on homilies focused on not making people feel uncomfortable or guilty along with a focus on the social gospel. This was still somewhat true when I was being prepared for Holy Orders in the 1990's. If you don't talk about sin, then you don't talk about Purgatory. They are intimately connected.

Tragically, this guidance has been followed so far that it has resulted in a generation of Catholics in the pews who misunderstand the nature of sin and its effects. Many question the existence of sin in a practical, personal way. Others see sin as inconsequential since God is going to take everyone to Heaven anyway.

It is indeed tragic because it takes away from the true joy we have to offer the world. Jesus Christ, our Savior, came into the world to free us from the eternal effects of sin. We know that Mortal Sin breaks our relationship with God immediately. Most of us do not knowingly commit Mortal Sin. We are tempted to minor or venial sins. Each time we sin, that sin leaves a stain on our soul. That stain is the temptation to sin again. We tend to view venial sins as pleasant and try as

hard as we might, we do tend to fall sometimes and commit them again. Each time we do, the stain, the temptation, gets stronger.

Christ's promise to us is that if we die in friendship with God, we will spend eternity with Him. He is all perfect and for us to stand in the presence of perfection, we need to be perfected. That means all of the stains of sin must be removed. That is the sole reason for purgatory. Purgatory is the time when we "undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven."

I rejoice that God has given us this vehicle to gain perfection and I look forward to the day when I enter Purgatory. Being there means I am going to be face to face with God for eternity.



