GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE— JACK SWAN, GRAND KNIGHT

Where has the year gone? Last month we, as American Families, celebrated Thanksgiving, giving pause in our busy lives to give thanks and appreciation to what God has given us regardless of what challenges we encounter in our life's journey. We are moving into **Advent Season** which prepares us for the celebration of our **Lord and Savior Jesus Christ's** birth. "**Unto us a Child is Born, unto us a Son is given**" **Christ the Lord!** Our **Holy Father** declared this year as "**the Year of Faith**", intending for us to renew the evangelizing responsibility that we all share as Catholics. The focal point of the declaration is our belief in the **Holy Trinity**. **The Knights of Columbus** embrace our rich history that we provide through the service to our Church. We proclaim through that service that there is one **God, who is Love and the Father**, that **His only Son Jesus Christ is our Savior**, and that the **Holy Spirit** leads our Church and us until His glorious return. As **Knights of Columbus**, we declare *that*, our Faith, and it motivates our reasons to do what we do for our Church and her people. Unfortunately, we have witnessed an increasingly secularized society, where a belief in **God** is no longer relevant to our decisions, and most alarming is that many self-named Catholics are among those that think that way. Our nation is facing the greatest challenge to our Christian values. Religion has become for many, an obstruction to freedom rather than a force that gave rise to the freedoms that we have enjoyed for two centuries. We as **Knights of Columbus** declare our freedom through **our Faith, our Hope and our God**. We must work to bring the opportunity of membership to the *greatest Catholic, Family, Fraternal organization* in the world, to others.

In that light, we have been offered an opportunity to bring upwards of \$1000 -\$2000 per month into our treasury to perform even more good works and to help our community even more than we now have possible with the budget that we have. We are in need of volunteers to help with BINGO that the **Rock Island Lions Club** has offered for us to conduct at their facility, but for us to earn income from. If we can generate enough interest in this effort we will pursue it as another fund raising effort. We will be putting together a committee to pursue this project, please consider helping when you are called to assist!

We recently held our **Vocations Drive** to help with the support of two seminarians this year. The ticket sales were a bit short of our goals but we thank all that chose to help in this effort. It's never too late to send in your support of the seminarians, although the drawing was held on Dec. 1st. Thanks to **Fred Luckenbill** for his tireless efforts to conduct this program.

Thanks also to **Louie Alongi** for leading the effort to provide **Knights of Columbus** Bell Ringers for the **Salvation Army Red Kettle Drive** this Christmas Season at Hy-Vee and thanks to all Brother Knights who have offered to help perform the Bell Ringing fund drive. The Knights will be at the R.I. Hy-Vee on Thursday, December 6th from 10:00am - 8:00 pm which means the **Salvation Army** will NOT have to pay anyone at this location and that ALL donations will go to help families celebrate Christmas. The Knights hope that all their members, friends, and St. Pius X Parish will be able to stop by Hy-Vee with a "smile and a donation"!

The last topic I'd like to address is the canonization process of our founder the **Venerable Father J. Michael McGivney**. I recently visited the **Knights of Columbus** Headquarters and **Saint Mary's Church** in New Haven, CN where the **Venerable Father J. McGivney's** body is entombed. I also visited with a **Sister of Life, Sister Veronica Mary**, who gives credit to **Father McGivney** for the miraculous saving of her brother's life, and has submitted her story to Rome to help in the Canonization effort. Just 6% of **Illinois Knights of Columbus** are members of the **Father McGivney Guild**. Increasing Guild membership is an important part of the Canonization process, we should all want to do our part, so I'm hoping to have copies of the Guild enrollment form mailed with our January Dues notices, and will have some copies at the officers and general council meetings for everyone to fill out. There is no cost to be a Guild Member.....please do this for our founder's cause!

Finally, May the **Joy of Christmas** keep us all *Centered on the Eucharist* where all good things come from. I wish all **Brother Knights** and their families a very good *Advent Season*, a very *Merry* and *Blessed Christmas* and a healthy, prosperous and **Holy New Year!**

DEACON'S QUESTION BOX

Where Were You on November 7th?

November 7th you might ask? On that evening, the Allouez Council came together to pray for the deceased members of the council and of the auxiliary. For a council of over three hundred men, it would be expected that the Church would have been packed. However, there were many, many seats available.

As Catholics, we believe that our justification is founded on our faith but is evidenced outwardly through our works. In the Sacraments we receive, God grants us His Grace which imparts His Life to us. God is infinite love. We in our finiteness cannot begin to contain this love within ourselves. So our faith and the grace God gives in response must flow out to others. This out flowing of love is called the works of charity or works of mercy. St. James reminds us that faith without works is dead (James 2:14-18). So if our faith is alive, our works must also be present.

Works of mercy are traditionally divided into corporal and spiritual works. The traditional enumeration of the corporal works of mercy is to feed the hungry; to give drink to the thirsty; to clothe the naked; to shelter the homeless; to visit the sick; to ransom the captive; and to bury the dead. The spiritual works of mercy are to instruct the ignorant; to counsel the doubtful; to admonish sinners; to bear wrongs patiently; to forgive offences willingly; to comfort the afflicted; to pray for the living and the dead.

Performing these works is not really an option. Remember the admonition of Christ in

Matthew 25, "Then he shall say to them also that shall be on his left hand: Depart from me, you cursed, in everlasting fire which was prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry, and you gave me not to eat; I was thirsty, and you gave me not to drink. I was a stranger, and you took me not in; naked, and you covered me not; sick and in prison, and you did not visit me." These are the corporal works. Since the spiritual works of mercy deal with a distress whose relief is even more imperative as well as more effective for the grand purpose of [man's creation](#), the injunction must be supposed to extend to them also.

So, most of the council missed an opportunity to perform a work of mercy; an opportunity to strengthen a virtue within. Importantly, it was an opportunity missed to strengthen the bounds of fraternity which is a hallmark of the Knights of Columbus. I strongly encourage you as a spiritual advisor to watch for next year's Memorial Mass and then make a serious intention to be there. Let's fill the church with our presence, our love for our brothers and sisters, and our praise for the God who has offered us eternal life.
