DEACON'S QUESTION BOX

What is the difference between Particular and General Judgment?

We all know that we will face a judgment after this life. There are numerous scripture passages that warn us of that. We also know that the outcome of that judgment is that we will either go to Heaven or to Hell for all eternity. All of us going to Heaven, except the Saints, will spend some time in Purgatory preparing to meet God face to face. We learn from the Church there is a Particular and a General Judgment. What is the difference and which one should I worry about?

At the end of life, we will experience Particular Judgment. At this moment, all opportunity to accept or reject the Divine Grace is ended. Judgment will be based on our relationship with the Lord at the moment of death. That is, we will be judged according to our holiness, faith, and love for Him, and for our

charity toward others. How we have lived out our lives bears witness to our love for Jesus or lack thereof. For a few, a final decision to accept (and make a good confession of our sins) or reject Jesus will determine our eternal fate.

The Particular Judgment immediately impacts the eternal destiny of our souls. The General Judgment will occur at the end of time. Those who have experienced the Particular Judgment will have their bodies united with their souls to experience the beatific vision. Those who have been damned will have their bodies united with their souls to experience eternal torment. And those who remain in purgatory will have their bodies united to their souls and will be given the gift of the beatific vision.

While the General Judgment is important, all of us need to be focused on our own Particular Judgment which may come at a time we least expect. We must be ready.
