DEACON'S QUESTION BOX

What was the Big Deal about Bishop Jenky's Homily?

I can imagine them as they read the news about Bishop Jenky's homily at the Men's March. The first thing they would do is race for a map to figure out where in the world Peoria was. Then they would scratch their heads and wonder what exactly a Bishop from a predominantly rural diocese could have said or done that would generate such furor. The secular news media, as usual, has no clue to the foundation on which the Bishop's remarks were made.

Living rightly simply means following the Ten Commandments and the precepts of the Sermon on the Mount. To live rightly means we are called not to commit sin personally and not to facilitate, encourage, or directly enable others to commit sin. The moral life, a life lived rightly, makes up the third section of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*.

The most difficult part of the moral life usually revolves around what constitutes sin in relationship to the acts of others. There have been volumes written on the differences between direct and indirect and between remote and proximate participation. For most of us, these are discussions held in a fairly rarified atmosphere and it is hard to apply them to our daily life. That is one of the principle reasons Jesus left His apostles and their successors, like Bishop Jenky, as the guardians and guides for the Church. It is important, especially when the bishops speak with one voice, for us to consider their words very seriously and to give them our holy allegiance.

As the Bishops have been very vocal in pointing out, it is our bound duty to express love for others through charity. This charity is not limited to our homes or to our faith community. It is offered freely to all of God's people. It is this charity that has led to the hospitals, schools, orphanages, and the services provided by Catholic organizations like Catholic Charities. It is not something we do because it is a nice thing to do. It is something we must do out of love for our Creator and for His Creation.

Intellectual elites and the media no longer have an adequate enough understanding of history to appreciate what the founding fathers were doing when they crafted the Declaration of Independence, the Constitution, and the Bill of Rights. When we read what they wrote during the time these documents were being crafted, we see they had a fear of what could happen in this country if the government was closely linked to one faith. They had seen the results of that relationship in Europe.

They were also concerned about the nature of a government that completely divorced itself from the moral values of Christianity. They recognized that to fully participate in society meant bringing those values into the public square where they would help inform and guide the actions of the government and the community. I suggest reading some of the material written by John Adams and James Madison. For example, James Madison wrote in 1825, "The belief in a God All Powerful wise and good, is so essential to the moral order of the world and to the happiness of man, that arguments which enforce it cannot be drawn from too many sources nor adapted with too much solicitude to the different characters and capacities to be impressed with it."

As Bishop Jenky pointed out in his homily, we have seen too many instances within the last one hundred years of what can happen when the voice of Christian moral values is prohibited in the public square. The two he mentioned, communism and fascism, were the most serious examples. But they certainly have not been the only ones. Our bishops are concerned that we in the United States do not follow that path.




