GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE— JACK SWAN, GRAND KNIGHT

Greetings Worthy Officers and Brother Knights, I pray that your Lenten season is going well for you. Last month I informed you that my wife & I would be attending the March for Life in Washington DC and at the risk of belaboring the topic (which is never possible), I wanted to inform you how that event came off. But first I wanted to mention the Pro-Life Rosary and Prayer Vigil held at the pro-life Women's Choice Center in Bettendorf, IA., and hosted by WCC Board President Jeff Scarpinato on Tuesday, Jan. 22nd the actual 40th Anniversary of Roe v. Wade Supreme Court Decision and commemorating the 55.8 million innocent lives lost to abortion. Our own Priest and Vicar, Father JERRY LOGAN and our Chaplin of Allouez Council Father STEVE LOFTUS led the gathering of 100+ in a very moving Pro-Life Rosary (the very best that I have ever participated in) and prayer service. To my knowledge a total of five Knights were in attendance including the two priests, I'm hopeful that more Knights would participate in this most worthy cause in the future.

On Thursday Jan.24th we attended the opening Mass for the National Prayer Vigil for Life at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception on the campus of Catholic University of American in DC, which is the largest Roman Catholic Church in America and in all of North America. There were over 13,000+ people in attendance including 862 Priests, Deacons, and Seminarians. The procession of the clergy took over 45 minutes with the entire Mass lasting 2.5 glorious hours. The upper Church was completely filled as well as the lower church where people could watch the Mass via closed circuit TV monitors. The Mass was also broadcast via EWTN. The first Mass held in 1974 included one priest and fifty people, but Knights might find it interesting that the Knights of Columbus actually started the March for Life by requesting a meeting with Nellie Gray, the designated founder of the March, to initiate a protest movement to the infamous decision by our Supreme Court. The next morning 40,000+ young people filled the Verizon Center for a Mass and Rally to start the day, and pre-rally to the Rally for Life on the Mall where approximately 650,000 marchers gathered previous to the actual March on Constituent Ave. up the Hill past the Capital to the steps of the Supreme Court. It was a Great Event and a way to keep the issue in front of the Nation. It will probably be an annual pilgrimage for Luann and I, we got to see our Daughter, Sister Bernadette Therese with the Sisters for Life, four days in a row!!!

At last month's General Council Meeting I awarded **Louie Alongi** and his daughter **Jennifer** the **Family Knight of the Month** for their efforts in the **Annual Allouez Council Spelling Bee Contest**. Due to the weather this event had to be rescheduled but the event came off very successful with all winners going on to the District Meet in Kickapoo this month. Thank you LOUIE and JENNIFER for a job well done, and for your continued commitment to this Youth project. Good Luck to our Jordan School winners, read about more details on this project elsewhere in this issue of the Abstracts. I also awarded the **Knight of the Month Award** to our Financial Secretary and Chairman of the Pro-Life Breakfast Project **Jeff Scarpinato**. JEFF continues to lead and improve our **Annual Sir Knight Larry Quane Pro-Life Pancake Breakfast** along with his trusty committee. Another reason that I awarded this prestigious award to Jeff was for his commitment to Charity and to his favorite charities including the **Knights of Columbus Allouez Council**, by purchasing a \$100,000 KC Life Insurance policy and designating seven of his favorite charitable organizations including Women's Choice Center, which he is President of the Board, and a \$10,000 benefit to our Council. I'm guessing others have done this previously but we certainly owe **Jeff Scarpinato** for all that he does for our Council and for including us as a beneficiary of his life insurance policy. What a **model Knight** that we can all emulate!! So be sure to make your appointment with **Bro. We are sorry to report the death of Sir Knight TERRENCE LENAGHAN who passed away on Thursday, February 14, 2013, at his home. A Mass of Christian Burial was held Tuesday, February 19, 2013. DEACON'S QUESTION BOX What Do You Call a 'Retired' Pope?

Today, we are living through a historic event in the life of the Church. The last Pope to step down was at the end of the Great Western Schism in the early 1400's. At the end of the Schism, there were actually three Popes, one in Avignon, France, one in Rome, and one in Pisa, claiming the Chair of Peter. To end the schism, two resigned and the third was excommunicated because he refused to resign. The College of Cardinals then elected a new Pope.

So what do you call a 'retired' Pope? Frankly, I am not sure anyone has a good answer to that question since it has been six hundred years since we had one. In fact, the director of the Vatican press office has admitted he does not have an answer. He will retain the rank of Cardinal in his retirement.

We can be sure that Pope Benedict won't be hanging around looking over the new Pope's shoulder. We know that he plans a quiet, private life of study and prayer. He will do his utmost to disappear from public view.

Is there a process for this and why hasn't it started? The process is exactly the same as if the Pope died in office. It cannot begin until the See of Peter is vacant which won't be until the 1st of March. The rules require the Cardinals be given fifteen to twenty days to get to Rome. This period would normally start on the 1st of March but given the situation, there is already discussions around adjusting this since the Cardinals all know and should already be preparing. The conclave should begin on or shortly before the 15th of March.

It is almost impossible to predict how long they will deliberate. There is not a list of highly recognized possible Popes. Given that, the Conclave may not be a short one.

Where will the new pope come from? There is a sense in the Church that men from the emerging areas of the world should be seriously considered. I am not sure the Church is ready for that but it is a distinct possibility. With the last two pope's coming from outside Italy, it is certain that where they come from will not be a key consideration.

As Catholics, we have a role to play in this process. We need to be praying for an increase in the guidance of the Holy Spirit at this time. Choosing a pope is not a political game like American elections. It is a careful assessment of who would make the best shepherd for the Church at this point in history.
