**REST IN PEACE**

On October 6, 2011, Brother JOHN W. CAMPBELL was called to his heavenly Father. JOHN was a first degree Knight of Allouez Council 658, having joined in 2007. His funeral was at St. Pius X Church in Rock Island with burial in Calvary Cemetery.

JOHN was born on March 5, 1929, in Rock Island. He worked as a parts man in the shipping and receiving department of Barjan LLC, Rock Island. JOHN was an Army veteran of the Korean War. At the time of his death, he was a resident of Heartland Healthcare Center, Moline. He is survived by several nieces and a nephew. His brother, Msgr. JAMES CAMPBELL, and a sister, MARY CAVINS, preceded him in death.



**DEACON'S QUESTION BOX**

**Was Mary Really Always a Virgin?**

The doctrine of Mary's perpetual virginity dates back to the very earliest periods of the Church. One can find hundreds of references to this dogma from the Church Fathers and the early Ecumenical Councils. For example, the documents from the Lateran Council in the mid-600's contain the following:

If anyone does not properly and truly confess in accord with the holy Fathers, that the holy Mother of God and ever Virgin and immaculate Mary in the earliest of the ages conceived of the Holy Spirit without seed, namely, God the Word Himself specifically and

truly, who was born of God the Father before all ages, and that she incorruptibly bore Him, her virginity remaining indestructible even after His birth, let him be condemned.

This teaching has been constantly put forward by the Popes, the Doctors of the Church, and the writings of the various councils. In our practical world, this is difficult to understand because it is totally foreign to what we experience. This perpetual virginity is something that could not happen in the normal course of human life. Ordinarily, she could not conceive and deliver a child and remain virgin. So we have to view this as extra-ordinary or, in short, an action directly and willed by God Himself; a miraculous event.

The Catechism teaches us that Mary's virginity is the sign of her faith which was not marred by any doubt and of her total gift of self to God's will. Mary's faith and self-giving stands as a sign of what ours should be striving to be. Because of this, she is looked on as the Mother of the Church. Like any mother, she remains intent on raising up her children to be totally human; that is, fully in love with God
