### DEACON'S QUESTION BOX

#### *Did Mary Need a Savior; After All, She Was Immaculately Conceived?*

Mary certainly thought she did. In Luke, after the visitation by the angel, Mary goes to her relative Elizabeth. Elizabeth greets her by proclaiming, "Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be

fulfilled.” Mary then responds, “My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my savior.”

Some Catholics believe the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception applies to Jesus’ conception. Jesus, the Son of God, did not need this gift. Mary, however, did receive the gift in anticipation of her role in the Incarnation of our Jesus.

All human beings following our first parents are conceived bearing the stain of original sin which is why we need the sacrament of Baptism. Mary would have been conceived in the same way except God interceded with a positive action to prevent Mary’s soul from bearing that stain. For the rest of us, that positive action occurs through Baptism.

Let me share an analogy I read recently. Suppose you are walking along a forest path. Unknown to you, there is a pit hidden in the path covered by leaves and branches. You don’t see it and fall in to the pit. After a while, a passerby stops and pulls you out. You are saved from the pit.

Suppose someone else is walking down a different path which also has a hidden pit. Just as that person is about to step into the pit, a passerby reaches out and pulls them back from the pit. Both of you are saved from the pit. One is saved in anticipation – before falling in – and one after falling in. Both of you needed and have a savior.
