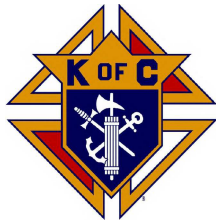

**DEACON'S QUESTION BOX**

**Do we have to believe Mary really appeared at Fatima, Lourdes, and other sites? (Part 1)**

While I fully recognize that the various Marian apparitions have very zealous followers, there is no obligation on the general Catholic population to believe in them just because the Church has approved them. The Church's approval basically says that

there is nothing counter to the faith involved in the apparition and that the belief in the apparition is not a danger to the faith.

As I have indicated before, our obligation as Catholics is to believe in general revelation as contained in Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition. General or public revelation ended with the death of the last Apostle, John. Marian apparitions are examples of private revelation. Private revelation is given to individuals in private. It may be one or more but the revelation is particularly for them. We are not guilty of sin if we decline to believe in someone else's private revelation. In fact, we should disbelieve in it if we doubt that it truly occurred because the evidence is not convincing.

Belief in the authenticity of a private revelation is not necessary for salvation unless you are the recipient of the private revelation and are convinced the revelation is from God or from one of His saints on His behalf. If you are convinced, your conscience should hold you obligated to believe and act on the message. If someone tells you that you can't be saved unless you believe in a particular apparition, be sure the person does not know what they are talking about.

The reasons for believing in specific Marian apparitions vary. Some people are convinced by the message itself. Others believe because of the trust in the testimony of the recipient of the apparition. Some are impressed by the signs or effects attributed to the apparition. And, of course, some are convinced by the miracles associated with the apparition.

In my next columns, I will talk about the apparitions at Fatima and Lourdes.

**STATE CONVENTION REPORT**

It was an honor to be nominated as an alternative delegate to the 113th Illinois State Convention of the Knights of Columbus held April 29<sup>th</sup> thru May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2011 at the Crown Plaza Hotel in Springfield, IL.

Saturday's General Session started with the Presentation of Colors and the Pledge of Allegiance, with opening prayer by our State Chaplain, Bishop Joseph Siegel and his observations of the importance and success of the Illinois State Council. We were then blessed with the remarks of each of our State Officers, then with the Awarding of the various Family, Program, and Knight of the Year awards. The morning session ended with the Overview of Charities and Fraternal Benefits comments.

We reconvened after lunch to witness the Fraternal Benefits Department awards where our District Agent Jeff Schaecher received an award for \$4 million of

Insurance in Force and the presentation of the "NEW" Third Degree. I think that the new Third Degree Ceremony will not only impress the new candidates but existing Knights as well. With the focus on the **Eucharist**, this new Degree should help us get more Knights actively involved and help with the retention of our Brother Knights. Once our Brother Knights observe this new Ceremony, I believe that all will more fully understand our commitment to those in need, to our Church and to our Savior, Jesus Christ. The importance of all the Degree Ceremonies and the purpose of the Knights of Columbus were made more clear to me.

The Caucus Sessions were then held to close the Saturday Sessions. The Saturday Evening Mass was held at St. Therese, Little Flower Catholic Church nearby. The Most Reverend Bishop Joseph Siegel, our State Chaplain, concelebrated the Mass with Father Chuck Tuttle, our Associate State Chaplain and all attending Council Chaplains and Ordained Clergy and Deacons.

After Mass we were back to the Convention Center to celebrate an evening of enlightenment and feast of Roasted Prime Rib or Alaskan Salmon. We were honored with remarks about the Church and the commitment of the Knights of Columbus to Her, by the Arch Bishop of the Springfield Diocese, about the Supreme Council by Logan Ludwig, Supreme Director, and then were addressed by Douglas Synder, the President of The Illinois Special Olympics. Kristen Bobell, a Special Olympics Athlete and Global Messenger told us about the importance of the Special Olympics and the commitment of the Knights of Columbus to such a worthy cause. The State Deputy then presented her with a ceremonial check for \$200,000.00 to exemplify the Knights contribution to the Special Olympics Program. The State Deputy then awarded the high honor of the State Medallion to several Knights including our own District Deputy Tony Scott. We were then blessed in closing by Prayer from our Associate State Chaplain Father Chuck Tuttle.

Once again, "Thank you!" for the opportunity to attend this year's convention.
