DEACON'S QUESTION BOX

Is it time for Catholics to stand against Obama-care?

By now, I suspect everyone knows of the announcement on the 20th of January 2012 by Health and Human Services Secretary Kathleen Sebelius that church-affiliated hospitals, agencies, and universities will have until August 2013 to provide contraception and sterilization in the health insurance they provide employees.

The executive order allows for a very small exception that would exempt religious institutions that employ only members of that faith and serve no one but members of that faith. And as we know, even if the current directive does not specifically say so, this administration considers abortion to be preventive health care for women. So it is almost inevitable that abortion will also be covered.

Clearly, virtually no Catholic institution would qualify under this exemption. Our faith calls for to care for and to minister to the world regardless of their belief. As Jesus cured and cared for people without asking directly for their faith in him, so must we. At the same time, we must honor the tenets of our faith and provide that care in a manner that does not violate those tenets and is in accord with a well formed conscience. Cardinal-designate Dolan stated, "In effect, the president is saying we have a year to figure out how to violate our consciences. To force American citizens to choose between violating their consciences and forgoing their healthcare is literally unconscionable. It is as much an attack on access to health care as on religious freedom. Historically this represents a challenge and a compromise of our religious liberty."

Is it time for Catholics to stand up and be vocal? Actually, it is overdue. One of the tragic consequences of the last decade is the loss of public prestige formerly accorded our bishops and clergy. They will be ignored in the public forum. Catholics and all people of good will must speak out and they must vote according to their consciences. Catholics make up one of the largest voting blocks in the country but rarely vote based on the teachings of the faith. The choice all Catholics now face is this; either we start participating in the public square informed by our faith or we will be ignored forever. This is a direct attack on the faith and, if there is no response, it is only the first of many more to come.

The bishops will lead us and they will be vocal even if the general public will not take them seriously. We owe them our complete support. Bishops will be the first to suffer. Francis Cardinal George made this stark and rather chilling observation of the current state of affairs, "I expect to die in bed, my successor will die in prison, and his successor will die a martyr in the public square.

Our first and continuing response must be prayer; prayer for our bishops and ourselves and prayer for our nation and its leaders. This is a spiritual battle we are entering. Saint Michael the Archangel; protect us.
