## GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE— JACK SWAN, GRAND KNIGHT

This morning as I enjoyed a cup of “chocolate” coffee with my lovely wife, Luann, I was reminded of a **Promise Keepers** event that I attended with a bus load of faithful **Baptist** men, by the **Promise Keepers** Coffee cup my wife served me with. It was a tremendous event that brought very faith filled men together to praise our **Lord Jesus Christ** with song and presentations from Protestant Ministers. They were very inspiring and moved me closer to Christ by the Glory that was given to our Lord! When I joined the **Knights of Columbus**, I recognized many of the same principles that the **Promise Keepers** presented to Christian men. We are committed to honor **Jesus Christ**, to pursue vital relationships with other Catholic men of faith, to practice personal integrity, to build strong marriages and families, to support our Priests, to demonstrate Biblical Unity, and to influence our communities for the good! Do you remember promising to carry your Rosary with you at all times and to use it daily to pray for your Brother Knights, your fellow Catholics, and your families among others? We are all called to do these things by the vows that we have taken to honor our Lord and Savior.

We as **Knights of Columbus** and Faithful Catholic men are confronted with the same question that was asked of Simon Peter; **“But who do you say that I am?”** This question, from an obscure Nazarene carpenter to an even more obscure Galilean fisherman, has proved to be the world’s most important query. How we as Knights, answer that question has profound implications for how we will lead our lives!! And, as C. S. Lewis pointed out some fifty years ago, Jesus left us with only three options: He was either a pathological liar, a deranged lunatic, or the Lord of the universe. For those of us who answer with Simon Peter, **“You are the Christ, the Son of the living God”**, a life of **radical discipleship** is required, particularly in this new millennium.

In this year of Faith, we are especially called to proclaim the **Lordship of Jesus Christ** and the possibility of a life-transforming friendship with Him, by evangelizing our Catholic Faith. What better way to do that than to practice the Mass as a counter cultural worship. Last month our Council co-sponsored an event referred to as **“The National Day of Remembrance”** including a field Mass at Calvary Mausoleum, and a rededication of the Monument of the Unborn, to commemorate the 55 million aborted babies committed over the last 40 years in our nation alone. Out of (360) members of our Council, we had (17) faithful Knights including the seven Fourth Degree Honor Guard Sir Knights and two priests and one deacon. Two Knights were actually from other Councils. About (50) people total attended the Mass. As Father Gibson said in his most gracious homily, **“we will never change this tragedy until we change ourselves”**. Do we really believe this murderous holocaust is wrong, and are we willing to take a stand against it? As **Knights of Columbus**, the answer should be a **resounding YES!!!** But, we must also be willing to take action against it.....**October is Respect Life month**, please attend the **Life Chain** on Oct. 6th, and the many Pro-Life activities that will be held this month, **including the Holy Hour that is scheduled at 5:00 PM before our October Council Meeting on the 10<sup>th</sup>**.

In August, we had minimal activity, but we were asked to support and help out at the **Great River Challenge Baseball Game @ Modern Woodman Park**. Our Council had three faithful Knights that answered that call. **Brothers Red Pearson, Louie Alongi, and Tarre Kroft** (with his 7 month pregnant wife, Kim) said yes to helping these disadvantaged youngsters with the biggest ballgame of the year for them. For this reason I have chosen **Red Pearson as our Knight of the Month for August**, and the **Tarre Kroft family as our Family of the Month of August**. Thank you from the many athletes that enjoyed the day, and from our Council as well to all three of you for answering this call. The experience is well rewarding for those that chose to help!!

In September our Council activities stepped up with a **Council Steak Fry, the National Day of Remembrance Mass**, and the annual **Intellectual Disabilities (ID) Drive**. Thank you to the (20) Knights including three priests and two deacons, that attended the Steak Fry, and thanks to **Brothers Dick Friedel and Bob Spalding** for coordinating the event. All that attended had a great time with a few card games thrown in before our Council Meeting. Thanks also to **Greg Vogle** for his efforts in coordinating the Mass at the Calvary Mausoleum for commemorating the (55) million Aborted Children over the 40 years of legalized abortion in our nation. And of course, thanks to **Louie Alongi, Fred Luckenbill** and their crew of Knights for conducting the **Annual Knights of Columbus ID Drive**. For the month of September I have chosen **Louie Alongi as our Knight of the Month** for his dedication to the disadvantaged children of our community for many years. Thank you Louie & Fred, once again, for a job well done. I have chosen the **Greg & Charlene Vogle Family as the Family of the Month of September** for their efforts in coordinating and set up of the Mass for The National Day of Remembrance. ### NDOLENCES

We sadly offer our most sincere condolences to the families of Sir Knight WILLIAM (BILL) LAWRENCE who passed to his creator on September 2, 2013. His funeral service was on September 9, 2013 at St. Pius X Church with burial at the Rock island National Cemetery, Arsenal Island. BILL was a catalyst in the rise of Allouez Council among the Illinois Councils during the 1980's. He was the Grand Knight when the K of C Hall was built and the Council's membership increase was the greatest in the world. He was a Knight for 74 years. He will be missed.

BILL was born on October 24, 1922, in Fulton, IL. He graduated from Fulton High School and later from St. Ambrose College in 1950. He married Barbara Jean Bierman on June 16, 1951, in St. Mary's Church, Rock Island. BILL served in the U. S. Navy during World War II. He was the civilian personnel officer at the Rock Island Arsenal, retiring in 1961.

He was a charter member of St. Pius X Church, serving as a past president of the parish council, a Eucharistic Minister, an usher and a member of the Plus 50 group. Besides being a member of Allouez Council, BILL was a charter member of the Father Edward J. Bader Assembly. He was also a member of the Moline American Legion Post 246, the Rock Island Conservation Club and the Rock Island Rotary Club.

He is survived by his wife of 62 years, Barbara, sons Bill, Tom and Bob and daughters, Marilyn and Kathy.

*May his soul, and all the souls of the faithful departed, rest in peace.*



### DEACON'S QUESTION BOX

#### How do Places of Worship Get Their Names?

The 1983 Code of Canon Law does not itself give any guidance to the naming of a Church or other place of worship. Canon 1217 merely states

the new church is to be dedicated or at least blessed by a solemn rite as soon as possible after it is completed following the laws of Sacred Liturgy.

When we look to the rite for the Dedication of a Church and an Altar, we find the liturgical law governing the choice of the name. there it states the name must be the Blessed Trinity; our Lord Jesus Christ invoked according to a mystery of his life or a title already accepted in the liturgy; the Holy Spirit; the Blessed Virgin Mary, likewise invoked according to some appellation already accepted in the liturgy; one of the angels; or, finally, a saint inscribed in the Roman Martyrology or in a duly approved Appendix. A blessed may not be the title without the permission of the Pope. A church should have one title only, unless it is a question of saints who are listed together in the Calendar.

It further reserves this dedication to the Bishop. So in law, the Bishop would hold the obligation for determining the name under which the church would be dedicated. In practice, the Bishop normally consults with his priests and with the people of the parish to be formed at the new church.

It is interesting to note that the above applies to the church building only. There is no explicit direction in the Code of Canon Law concerning the name of the parish that would worship at that church. In 1999, the Congregation for Divine Worship and Discipline of the Sacraments stated, "The name of a parish may commonly be the same name as the title of the parish church."

When is this distinction important? As we have seen in our own diocese, if two parishes are merged and both churches remain open, the churches retain their names and the merged parish may be given a new name by the Bishop.


