PRO-LIFE MESSAGE

I wanted to thank Grand Knight David Yordy for sending out the Bishop's Pro-Life Novena to our council membership prior to the March for Life and hoped you all prayed it daily. We, Luann, Tina Olson (Andy's daughter who was with us) and I prayed the Novena daily. Tina read the intercessions and led us in the prayers, and reading the reflection and one step further comments. She did a remarkable job, and was a delight to have with us. We attended Mass at the Basilica of Saint Mary in Alexandria, VA. and experienced the Blessing and Grace that the Knights of Columbus was hosting the Relic of St. Jean Vianney's Incorrupt Heart of the Cure' of Ars, the Major Relic Pilgrimage that the Knights of Columbus are sponsoring.....We were able to touch our rosaries, prayer cards, and Crucifixes to the reliquary holding the relic to make third class relics of them.
We also visited the Arlington National Cemetery and witnessed the changing of the guard at the Tomb

the Unknown Soldier and visited the Grave Site of President John F. Kennedy and family as well as others...great day and there was so much more, including the snow monster of winter storm Harper. Saw many school groups here for the March, as well as many Knights of Columbus. This was the 45th March for Life held in Washington DC. There are now over (75) Cities that Marches for Life are held, which would seem to diminish the numbers attending the March in DC, but hundreds of thousands of Pro-Lifers still attend whether the weather is accommodating us or not.

These Pro-Lifers understand that the horrible reality of the global abortion racket is that **a baby is killed by abortion every second.** These delicate little humans are savagely torn from what should be a warm and safe home for nine months. This is truly the greatest human rights abuse in history ...it is the largest reason for death in our nation, more than cancer, stroke, and heart disease combined.

God's precious children are being ripped apart or chemically executed — and they're helpless against the poisonous drugs and dismemberment devices used by abortionists. Abortion is the greatest sin that Satan uses to destroy women and families, let alone the destruction of millions of unborn lives, plus the results of this sin have on marriage and families in our society in future generations.

We have learned recently the stark marriage statistics in middle-class America. Dramatic increases in nonmarital childbearing, divorce, and family instability among the working class mean that only about 55 percent of children with working-class mothers will reach age 14 in a home headed by two biological parents. Meanwhile, only minorities of poor adults (26 percent) and working-class adults (39 percent) ages 18 to 55 are married, all leading to more abortion and family destruction.

The numbers are somewhat healthier among America's educated upper-class, but the weakening of marriage in middle-America means that the backbone of the country is weakening. For right behind these bleak marriage statistics, as Fox News host Tucker Carlson noted in a "controversial" recent monologue on his show, are "all the familiar disasters that inevitably follow—more drug and alcohol abuse, higher incarceration rates, fewer families formed in the next generation."

Carlson has made a name for himself lately for sounding the alarm on the crisis in the family. "If you want to put America first, you've got to put its families first," he concluded his recent monologue. "A country without strong families is a weak country," he noted in another recent monologue, adding: "Supporting marriage and children is the best, maybe the only way for Republicans or any of us to save the country."

Carlson is no doubt right: we need visionary political leaders who can devise visionary economic and political policies that support families instead of tearing them down. We need policies that encourage childbearing within families instead of promoting abortion and death. But, we also urgently need visionary spiritual leaders who understand the scope of the problem, and are willing and able to challenge their flocks to build and heal their own families...one family at a time, one day at a time.

I'll never tire of quoting Pope St. John Paul II on this same topic: "As the family goes, so goes the nation and so goes the whole world in which we live."

What Does the Term 'Practical Catholic' Mean?

We are all aware that membership in the Knights of Columbus requires a man be at least eighteen years old and a practical Catholic. Since the term 'practicing' is not used, there must be a distinction between 'practicing' and 'practical'. What is this distinction? What does it mean to be a practical Catholic?

Many people claim to be practicing Catholics. That may mean 'baptized and occasionally attending Mass and have a great relationship with Jesus'. Or that might mean 'attending Mass every week, frequently receiving the Sacraments, and striving to live the faith'. Or it could mean almost anything in between.

When the Knights use the term 'practical', there is a very specific meaning. On the Supreme website, we read, "A practical Catholic accepts the teaching authority of the Catholic Church on matters of faith and morals, aspires to live in accord with the precepts of the Catholic Church, and is in good standing in the Catholic Church." There are three principle elements to this definition.

First, a practical Catholic "accepts the teaching authority of the Catholic Church on matters of faith and morals". Accepting the teaching authority means we accept all the dogmas of the Church that define our faith and we accept the moral teachings of the Church which apply our faith to everyday life even when they are difficult. We may not always understand these teachings but we accept our obligation to live by them and to endeavor to better understand them.

Second, a practical Catholic "aspires to live in accord with the precepts of the Catholic Church". According to the Catechism of the Catholic Church paragraphs 2042 and 2043, there are five precepts. They are (1) attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation, (2) confess your sins at least once a year, (3) receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season, (4) observe the days

of fasting and abstinence established by the Church, and (5) provide for the needs of the Church.

Note the word used is 'aspire'. This word recognizes that we are not perfect in keeping our intentions. Hence, for example, if we skip church one Sunday, we do not have to resign our membership in the Knights. However, we are obliged to go to Confession as it is a grave sin to willingly skip Mass on a Sunday.

Third, a practical Catholic will "be in good standing in the Catholic Church". This means you can approach the Sacrament of the Eucharist in a worthy manner. Worthy reception of the Eucharist means accepting all the Church teaches concerning the Eucharist and not having mortal sin on the soul.

In short, for practical Catholics, the faith is at their very core and defines how they live their life. If you find that you have any struggles with any of these three items (again, we are imperfect), I recommend you schedule some time to sit down with Father or a trusted spiritual advisor and discuss them.

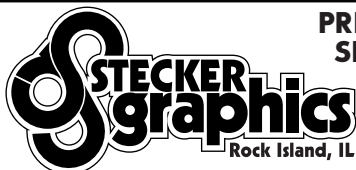
