GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE

It's that time of year where we transition from the Christmas season to our preparation for Jesus' death and resurrection with Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. As our clergy has reminded us, it is now time for us to prepare for Lent; to pray and consider what sacrifices you will offer this year to honor Jesus and praise Him for His sacrifice to save us. Of course, I have a few things for you to consider that the Knights are offering this year to help you prepare for Lent. Consider these opportunities to enrich your Lenten experience this year:

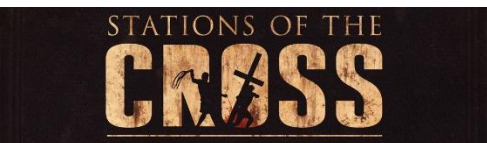

Greetings Worthy Brother Sir Knights,

On Saturday February 16th, Faithful Comptroller Bud Phillis and I attended the Fourth Degree Exemplification held in Lisle IL. to witness **Sir Knights Thomas DePorter** and son **Tad** become Fourth Degree members. Bud and I only attended the ceremonial, but certainly witnessed a great event taking place at the Sheraton Lisle Naperville Hotel where **(175) knights** came into the Fourth Degree. It was a wonderful ceremonial where several members of several Police and Fire Fighter forces and several Military members as well as priests and deacon were Knighted alongside of Tom and Tad. It was the largest Exemplification I've witnessed to date. Many Dignitaries were in attendance as well. ***We are proud to have Tom join our ranks and will present his Exemplification Certificate at our April meeting.***

EVERRETT MANNING'S OBITUARY

Everett A. Manning, 85, of Rock Island, passed away peacefully on Monday, February 18, 2019 at UPH-Trinity Rock Island surrounded by his loving family.

A Mass of Christian Burial was at 10:00 am on Monday, February 25, 2019 at St. Pius X Catholic Church, Rock Island, followed by burial at National Cemetery, Rock Island, with military rites conducted by the Moline American Legion Post #246. Visitation were held from 1:30 pm to 4:30 pm on Sunday, February 24, 2019 at Wheelan-Pressly Funeral Home and Crematory, with the recitation of the rosary at 12:30 pm., followed by the Father Edward J. Bader Assembly Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus Service. Memorials may be made to the Quad City Right to Life facilities or St. Pius X Catholic Church, Rock Island.

Everett was born to Floyd and Elizabeth (Wilburn) Manning on July 28, 1933 in Andover, IL. He married Norma DeCommer on September, 29, 1956 at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Rock Island. Everett was inducted into the Orion High School Sports Hall of Fame, and served as president of his graduating class.

AUTHENTIC ITALIAN DINNER 4/6

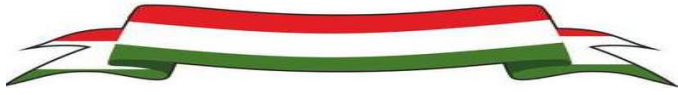

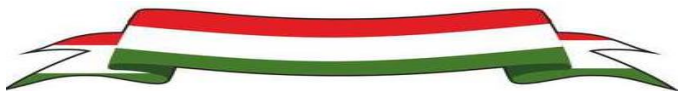
ITALIAN BASKET RAFFLE

PRO-LIFE MESSAGE

My wife Luann and I, and Andy Olson's daughter Tina experienced a great March for Life event again this past January 18th. We had at least (5) Allouez Knights in attendance at the March this year. The Vigil Mass held at the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception Basilica on the Campus of Catholic University of America. It was estimated that over twenty thousand people were in attendance at the Vigil Mass in the upper and lower church and all the side chapels. The next morning we attended Mass at the St. Patrick Church near the National Mall celebrated by Timothy Cardinal Dolan and other clergy with the Sisters of Life providing music. We made our way to Constitution Avenue to join up with hundreds of thousands of dedicated pro-lifers readying for the March from the National Mall to the Supreme Court. Some great presentations were made

at the National Mall including Supreme knight Carl Anderson, Vice President Mike Pence and a telephone message from Pro-Life President Donald J. Trump. The participants were solemn but also joyful as songs were sung and prayers were lifted up. People were celebrating Life, yet standing up for and marching for those who have no voice.

I can't imagine a more horrible irony. On Tuesday, January 22, New York Governor Andrew Cuomo ordered that the spire of the One World Trade Center be lit pink. The reason why? To celebrate the passage of a new law that radically liberalizes abortion in New York State – in some cases allowing abortion up until the moment of *birth*, permitting non-doctors to perform abortions, and removing recognition of preborn babies older than 24 weeks as potential homicide victims.

The new One World Trade Center is built on the same ground where thousands of innocent Americans – including eleven unborn babies – lost their lives on 9/11. The new building is supposed to stand as a symbol of America's resilience in the face of evil, a memorial to those who lost their lives. Yards away from the building, the 9/11 memorial explicitly honors the "unborn child" of each of those eleven pregnant women who died on that infamous day.

And yet, Gov. Cuomo – who considers himself a Catholic – had the gall to use this self-same building to "celebrate" a profoundly divisive and extreme law that will ensure that far more innocents will lose their lives in the coming years in New York. Bizarrely, this is the same man who announced last fall that – "in solidarity with Pope Francis" – he was going to end the death penalty in New York. Get that? He's with Pope Francis on not giving lethal injections to convicted murderers – but innocent unborn babies? That's a different story.....

Cuomo hailed the new law – passed on the anniversary of the Roe v. Wade decision – as "a historic victory for New Yorkers and for our progressive values." He also ordered the Governor Mario M. Cuomo Bridge, the Kosciuszko Bridge, and the Alfred E. Smith Building in Albany to be lit pink in order – as he said – to "celebrate this achievement and shine a bright light forward for the rest of the nation to follow."

God forbid!

God's mercy is infinite. Even the most extreme and hardened of sinners must be given the opportunity to repent – and yet I can well understand why some Catholic leaders are raising their voices asking when New York Cardinal Timothy Dolan will formally and publicly excommunicate Gov. Cuomo. By all means, privately offer Gov. Cuomo every opportunity to recant. But if he is allowed to so publicly flout the absolute most *basic* of Catholic moral teachings by going so far as to co-opt some of New York's most visible land-marks to express his boundless enthusiasm for the legalized murder of innocents, without any consequences from Church leaders, what message does this send?

Then there's the Mystery of Evil. Moments after the new law passed the New York Senate, pro-abortion legislators and observers burst into raucous cheers. What kind of people are we? How can so many be utterly blind to such gross and manifest

evil? These people were cheering. They were *cheering*. Where did this fanatical commitment to ensuring that the lives of children in the womb count for nothing—indeed less than nothing—come from? How did this contempt for human life, insinuate itself into people’s hearts?”

Of course, since then many more “progressive” States have run to pass legislation to match or even go farther by suggesting that the babies should be able to be aborted after birthing. Our own state of Illinois has a Governor now that wants to be known as the most progressive state in the nation when it comes to provoking abortion, the willful destruction of innocent human life. **What happened in New York and other progressive states last month was tragic. But it was a teaching moment in that it made clear the left’s views on a deeply divisive issue. How will Catholics stand on this issue? With their church’s teaching or with the left?**

The mystery of evil is precisely that – a mystery. We must pray for every one of those pro-abortion legislators that they will experience conversion of heart, and that God will forgive them the grave crimes they perpetrate. And we must work and pray to overturn these despicable, unjust laws. There is a war on for the soul of our country, and for the lives of its most innocent citizens. Apathy is not an option.

To Excommunicate or Not?

Since New York Governor Andrew Cuomo signed and celebrated the passing of a new law that allows abortion to be performed by anyone up to the final moments before birth, there has been considerable news coverage devoted to the Catholic reaction. Since Mr. Cuomo identifies himself as a faithful Catholic, much of that coverage centers around whether he should be excommunicated or not. The media has been enjoying the controversy as first one commentator demands that he should be and then another defends Cardinal Dolan’s apparent decision not to.

Canon law establishes several penalties for grievous sins against the Church. For lay people, they are two – interdict and excommunication. Canon law also lists the specific actions that would call for these penalties. Canon 915 states that anyone under interdict or excommunication or who obstinately persists in manifest grave sin, is not to be admitted to Holy Communion.

The penalties of excommunication or interdict are normally applied after a juridical process has been followed. Depending on the situation, it may be a simple process such as a meeting with the offender reminding him or her of the teachings of the faith and then inviting them to recant and do penance. If that is refused, then the penalty would be imposed. Other situations could require an investigation, a judicial trial, or some other steps. In the case of Governor Cuomo, there are concerns expressed by

canon lawyers that his actions may even qualify for excommunication.

But let us step back a moment. These penalties have two goals; bringing the accused back into full communion with the Church and strengthening the faithful against the effects of scandal. If we can’t be sure one or both are possible, is the application of the penalty appropriate?

In the High Middle ages when the Church’s social impact was at its greatest, any form of penalty by the Church had significant social impacts. Today, that would not be true. More and more, especially since the 1960’s when we elected our first Catholic President who very publicly did not live a Catholic life, our social impact has become negligible. Witness to that fact is the wide spread use of contraception, the acceptance of divorce, and the falling numbers of Catholics who feel they need to go to Mass. The impact perceived by Mr. Cuomo would probably be nil and would be seen by the public as not worth their attention. So the individual corrective goal would not be achieved.

This same argument also suggests that the impact on the lay Catholics would also not be really significant. After sixty years of poor, incomplete catechesis on the faith, most Catholics today would probably respond that all is okay as long as Mr. Cuomo has a good relationship with Jesus and maintains a private prayer life. The Sacraments are not seen as necessary. So excommunication, appropriate or not, likely will not produce the desired effect with the people.

What does need to happen is a more focused, complete, and vocal presentation of the faith by the Church. We, the whole Church, need to focus less on prudential matters that are in the realm of the public square and more on the matters that define our faith and help us live it well. This includes the hard truths as well as the easy ones. It will take time, persistence, and love but it will ultimately make our voice stronger, our impact on society more significant, and, most importantly, help more souls get to heaven.

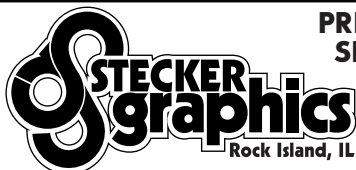
