#### **DEACON'S QUESTION BOX**

See the Abstract Archives for a list of past questions. Why Did the Jewish Leaders Say to Pilate 'They Could Not Execute Jesus'?

This question was asked several months ago. The Bible is silent on this and clearly reports stonings occurred before and after Jesus' Crucifixion. In Deuteronomy we find a list of crimes which carry stoning as the punishment. So this question took some research and some consideration in order to bring to you a probable reason. Please note this is conjecture on my part based on research and it is not Church doctrine.

Rome often allowed a degree of latitude on the governance of local regions like Judea. In order to make sure people remembered who ruled whom, certain serious matters like capital punishment were reserved to the Romans. In practice, stonings continued and were ignored by Roman officials. These were largely outside Jewish judicial trials, were not highly public figures, and were usually spontaneous like the woman caught in adultery.

St. Stephen would be a case in point. While his condemnation came at the hands of the Sanhedrin, he was not a well-known person. There was little risk of public outcry and they could make the case that the crowd spontaneously stoned Stephen because of his speech.

Jesus was a well-known figure even to the Romans. Stoning Jesus created the very good possibility that there would be a public uprising by those who followed Him. This would have caused a violent response by Pilate. By taking Jesus to Pilate, Jewish leadership was off the hook with the people and the risks of a public uprising were minimized.

There is one other consideration to be made. In Deuteronomy, executing someone and hanging the body on a tree indicated the dead man was under God's curse. A devout Jew would have easily made the connection between the cross and the tree of Deuteronomy. The Jewish leaders were sending a message to the Jews. Jesus is not only condemned for 'heresy' but cursed as well. This would also tend to minimize the possibility of a public uprising.

It appears to me that the Jewish leadership was acting less as religious leaders and more as political leaders trying to stem the growth in numbers of Jesus' followers and, at the same time, keep the peace. Keeping the peace kept Pilate at bay and they kept what power the Roman governor was allowing them to have.

And so we read in John 11 after the raising of Lazarus from the dead:

The chief priests and the Pharisees convened the Sanhedrin and said, "What are we going to do? This man is performing many signs. If we leave him alone, all will believe in him, and the Romans will come and take away both our land and our nation." But one of them, Caiaphas, who was high priest that year, said to them, "You know nothing, nor do you consider that it is better for you that one man should die instead of the people, so that the whole nation may not perish."




#### "SAVE THE DATE"

#### <u>THE CONNECTION BETWEEN LONGEVITY</u> <u>AND PURPOSE IN LIFE</u>

A recent study has linked a strong sense of purpose with a lower risk of all-cause mortality after age 50. The study followed about 7,000 adults over the age of 50. Researchers assigned life-purpose scores based on participants' responses and followed up with them five years later. They found that participants who had the lowest life-purpose scores were twice as likely to have died than those with the highest scores.<sup>1</sup>

There continues to be a growing body of research to support the impact of purpose on mental and physical health and how it can lead to longer life expectancy.<sup>2</sup>

#### Finding purpose leads to a longer life

There is evidence to suggest that having a strong sense of purpose can impact health and longevity for the long haul.<sup>3</sup>

Finding your sense of purpose could come through career, faith, family, community, or more likely, a combination of these.

#### **Components of purpose**

According to Richard Leider, "the first step toward unlocking your purpose is to mine your life story for major threads and themes that reveal your lifelong gifts, passions, and values.<sup>3</sup>

Then, by examining your approach to the following:

Having (Outer Life) The dimension of your external experience and activity—how effectively you relate to the "having" choices in your life. Doing (Inner Life) The dimension of your internal experience and inner activity—how effectively you relate to the "doing" choices in your life. Being (Spiritual Life) The dimension of your invisible experience and spiritual activity—how effectively you relate to the "being" choices in your life.<sup>3</sup>

#### Shared purpose in times of weakness

No one gets through life unchallenged or undefeated, at least in some way. When you are not your strongest self, shared purpose with those who share your values can help you through and out of times of stress, personal loss, or a loss of your sense of purpose.

#### ...and in times of strength

You have probably heard it before, perhaps you have even said something like: "there are few things more rewarding than helping someone in need." In helping others, you not only feel better about your purpose in life, but you may have helped them reconnect with their own sense of purpose.

#### Doctors know there is a connection

No one really knows for sure how spirituality is related to health. However, it seems the body, mind, and spirit are connected. The health of any one of these elements seems to affect the others.<sup>4</sup> **Path to improved health.** Identify the things in your life that give you a sense of inner peace, comfort, strength, love, and connection. Set aside time every day to do the things that help you spiritually. These may include doing community service or volunteer work, praying, meditating, singing devotional songs, or attending religious services.<sup>4</sup>
