#### FAITHFUL NAVIGATOR'S MESSAGE

Greetings Sir Knights,

At our February Assembly meeting we heard from our Uniform Committee in regards to how do we get the Honor Guard to the New Uniform and what we can use in the interim until we get there. The following is a summary of the committee proposal. There is no going back to the use of the Cape & Chapeaux for it is officially retired, but we can facilitate our Senior Sir Knights and still provide an Honor Guard for our official duties at Funerals, Rosaries, Chalice Presentations, Masses, and other duties by allowing the use of the Tux or Black Suite, with Service Baldric & Sword and White Gloves without the Cape & Chapeaux. While I certainly encourage all Honor Guard members to consider buying the new uniform, we will in the interim utilize this alternate as we will still provide this important part of our Assembly Duties.

We have determined that the reduced price (\$449.00) source for the new uniform which is The Supply Room (TSR) located in Oxford, Alabama, is the *only* legitimate and authorized source for the new uniform. It is a domestic provider and you must deal directly with them in ordering the uniform and the color beret patch. The Supreme Master's Office will not accept any more order requests. I have included the web site of **TSR** for your convenience: www.kofcuniform.com; their toll-free telephone number is 833-562-4327. But remember you will need to have it altered and you will need an official shirt that's not included in that price. TSR is submitting a white shirt and a black overcoat for approval by the Supreme Master, and will have these items available upon approval, probably sometime this month.

To facilitate the purchase of the new uniform for those willing to do so, but may not have the immediate resources, the Assembly will make a two year loan up to \$480.00 with a payback within two years and a monthly payment amount determined by the amount of the loan divided by 24 monthly payments. Our Comptroller and Purser will work together on this effort. Make you request to Comptroller Bud Phillis and he will make a voucher to Purser Mike Daly to write a loan check to you and set up the repayment schedule with you. My thanks to the Uniform Committee; Louie Alongi, Mike Daly, Bud Phillis and John Wuerzburger for their work on this process.

We have the **Rock Island Saint Patrick's Mass** & Parade coming up this month on Sat. March 14th. The Honor Guard will be serving at the Mass at St. Mary Church in RI as previously stated, Tux or Black Suit with Service Baldric, Sword, and White Gloves only, (no Cape or Chapeaux). Mass will be at 10:00 AM, so be there early at 9:30 AM to dress and get instruction from our Commander. Dress warm for the Parade which will start after Mass at 11:30 AM. We typically have the Float set-up behind (south) the church on the one way going east. Please try to help SK Lowell Gramling set up the trailer float immediately after Mass, (and again for tear down afterwards). The St. Patrick's Society will be providing donuts, pastries, coffee, and juice in Schroeder Hall prior to Mass starting at 8:00 AM, (*remember your fasting*) and after Mass until 11:30 AM. Please be generous in your free will offering.

You may have heard of the changes made to our Council Knight Exemplification reducing all three Degrees into one, celebrated hopefully in the church after Mass and with families included at the event. My understanding is that the Fourth Degree Exemplification will now be considered full Knighthood with changes being proposed to that exemplification coming as well. (None to date though)

I'm writing this message prior to the date, but we have (4) Candidates that made the Exemplification in Lisle, IL. on Sat. February 22<sup>nd</sup>.



We congratulation and welcome these new Sir Knights to our Assembly; (pictured left to right) SK James Britton, SK Dave Sullivan, SK Dean Lackey, & SK Dick Hunt, all from Allouez Council. It's great to have you among our ranks as achieving full Knighthood.

It is my hope that we will see additional candidates from ALL District 57 Councils in the near future. Talk to your Brother Knights in your Councils to encourage consideration in becoming a Sir Knight soon.

#### RICHARD FRIEDEL

#### March 25, 1938- February 10, 2020



ROCK ISLAND - Richard Norbert Friedel, 81, of Rock Island, died Monday, Feb. 10, 2020, at Silver Cross Health Care Center, Rock Island following a long and courageous battle with a neuro-degenerative disease.

A Mass of Christian Burial was at 10 a.m. Friday at St. Pius X Catholic Church, Rock Island.

Entombment was at Calvary Mausoleum, Rock Island. A rosary was recited at 3:30 p.m. Thursday at the Knox Chapel of Wheelan-Pressly Funeral Home and Crematory, 2106 7th Ave., Rock Island. Visitation was from 4 to 7 p.m. at the Chapel. Memorials may be made in care of St. Pius X Catholic Church, Alleman High School or Jordan Catholic School, all of Rock Island.

Dick was born in Fond du Lac, Wis. on March 25, 1938, the eldest son of Norbert and Leone (Wood) Friedel. Following graduation from St. Mary's Springs Academy, Fond du Lac, he served active and reserve military duty in the U.S. Army. In 1961, he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration from St. Norbert College in De Pere, Wis. A lifelong Green Bay Packers fan, he sold Pabst Blue Ribbon beer at Lambeau Field while in college.

He married Marlene J. Kordick on Oct. 16, 1965 at Holy Trinity Catholic Church, Des Moines, Iowa. After their wedding, they settled permanently in Rock Island, where they raised their two children, Jennifer and Thomas. Marlene died on Nov. 11, 2018.

Dick was employed as a pharmaceutical sales representative by Smith Kline & French Laboratories, which later became GlaxoSmithKline (GSK) through a series of corporate mergers. In 2003, he retired from GSK after 38 years of service. He then worked as a part-time driver for Hot Shots Nuclear Medicine in Davenport, Iowa.

He was an active member of St. Pius X Catholic Church, where he sang in the adult and funeral choirs and was a perpetual adoration volunteer. He was a member of the Allouez Council 658 Knights of Columbus, Edward J. Bader Assembly Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus. He was recognized by his council as Knight of the Year (1967) and Senior Knight of the Year (2009).

Always ready with a smile and a funny story, Dick never forgot a name or detail about someone he met. He enjoyed hunting and watching sports -- especially football. He left behind a legacy of faith, hard work, determination and love of family.

Left to cherish his memory are his daughter, Jennifer (James) Sautter of Blue Grass, Iowa and their sons, John and William; son, Thomas (Dana) Friedel of Dubuque, Iowa and their children Monica and Joseph. He is also survived by his siblings, Ronald (Sandy) Friedel of Brown Deer, Wis., John (Jennifer) Friedel of Green Bay, Wis. and Julie (Tom) Petrie of Fond du Lac.; many nieces, nephews and extended family members.

He was preceded in death by his wife of 53 years, Marlene; parents; brother, William and infant sister, Mary Therese. Richard's family would like to extend a special thank you to his caregivers from Silver Cross, Hospice Compassus and Home Instead Health Care.



#### **DEACON'S QUESTION BOX**

See the Abstract Archives for a list of past questions. Do the Four Squares Surrounding the Cross on the Front of the Ambo Have a Meaning?

St. Pius installed a new Ambo recently. It is beautiful and it appears to have been made specifically for that sanctuary. Shortly after it was installed, I got the question about the four squares that surround the cross. I suggested taking a closer look at them. They contain the figure of a winged man, a winged lion, an eagle, and a winged ox. My questioner was now even more confused.

The Ambo by liturgical tradition is reserved for the proclamation of Sacred Scripture and the homily which opens up scripture to our hearts. Within scripture, we find Ezekiel's vision of heaven (Ezekiel

1:1-21). There he describes seeing four creatures (the winged winged man. lion. winged ox, and eagle) sparkling 'with a gleam like burnished bronze'. In John's vision recorded in Revelation (4:6-8), we see the same creatures singing "Holy, holy, holy, is the Lord God Almighty, He who



was, and who is, and who is to come!"

When considering these images which occur in both Old and New Testament, St. Irenaeus likened them to the four Gospel writers because of their particular focus on Jesus.

St. Matthew is represented by the winged man because his gospel highlights Jesus entry into the world. It relates His family lineage, His Incarnation, and birth. "This then," according to St. Irenaeus, "is the Gospel of His humanity; for which reason it is, too, that the character of a humble and meek man is kept up through the whole Gospel."

St. Mark is represented by the winged lion because he begins by referencing Isaiah 'I send my messenger before you to prepare your way: a herald's voice in the desert, crying, "Make ready the way of the Lord, clear Him a straight path." To St. Irenaeus, the voice in the desert reminds us of a lion's roar. The lion is also a symbol of royalty which is appropriate for the Son of God.

St. Luke is represented by the winged ox. The ox was a sacrificial animal in the temple. St. Luke begins his Gospel with Zechariah, the priest. He includes the parable of the Prodigal Son where a calf was slaughtered in joy. This parable foreshadows the joy we experience when we are reconciled through Jesus' self-sacrifice. The winged ox reminds us of the priestly character of our Lord.

St. John is represented by the eagle. John begins his gospel with the theologically lofty prologue; "In the beginning was the Word, the Word was in God's presence, and the Word was God. He was present to God in the beginning." John's gospel alone among

the four presents the reader with the most profound teachings of our Lord such as the Bread of Life discourse. Jesus describes Himself as "the way, the truth, and the life" and promises that those who embrace Him will rise to life everlasting.

According to the writings of St. Irenaeus, "The first living creature was like a lion" symbolizing His effectual working, His leadership, and royal power; "the second was like a calf," signifying His sacrificial and sacerdotal order; but "the third had, as it were, the face as of a man," — an evident description of His advent as a human being; "the fourth was like a flying eagle," pointing out the gift of the Spirit hovering with His wings over the Church. And therefore, the Gospels are in accord with these things, among which Christ Jesus is seated.

Since St. Irenaeus, these four icons have become traditionally representative of the four Gospel writers. The depiction of the four living creatures reminding us of the Gospels truly is fitting for the front of the Ambo where the Good News is proclaimed.

#### **PRO-LIFE MESSAGE**

In my recent reports given on my attendance to the **2020 March for Life** to our Council Officers, our Assembly, and my Council membership, I mentioned that President Trump was the first President to attend the Rally on the Mall prior to the March for Life, in person and is actually the most Pro-Life President we have ever had.....much to the chagrin of some of my Brother Knights that may not care for him. I know that politics aren't proper for our Knights meetings and we're asked to leave our politics at the door, but I'm just stating facts, (Abortion should not be a Political issue) and hope to help all Knights understand why it is important to know these facts to better understand what lives are at stake when they are neglected. One thing I failed to mention was that during the March for Life, Attorney General William Barr and an Associate from the Dept. of Justice stood on his balcony of the Dept. of Justice Building in D.C. waving to attendees of the March and encouraging us on. One doesn't understand how inspiring it is to know that we finally have such support amongst the highest offices of the land, and not just being ignored, or even despised.....

Pro-life leaders everywhere agree that the sheer amount of pro-life activity undertaken by the Trump administration has far exceeded all expectations. However, what I find remarkable is that this activity includes initiatives that won't grab big headlines in the media, but that are having a dramatically positive impact on the ground. These sorts of pro-life initiatives can't be ascribed to cynical politicking or electioneering, since in many cases even relatively well-informed pro-life

Americans won't even know about them or appreciate their importance.

<u>Case in point:</u> Several weeks ago, the administration hosted an international strategy conference about **how to promote the pro-life case at the global level. Representatives of 34 different countries attended.** This included ambassadors, ministers, and other government officials. At the conference, U.S. Secretary of Health and Human Services (HHS) Alex Azar delivered a blockbuster pro-life speech.

Secretary Azar did not couch his words in the sterile and ambiguous diplomatic language that infects international politics, but rather laid out a crystal-clear agenda. "I stated this fact at the United Nations this past September, and I'll repeat it here: that there is no international human right to abortion," he said. "On the other hand, there is an international human right to life". He added: "President Trump has been clear, at the U.N. and on the world stage: Health care exists to improve health and preserve human life—the universal goal we all share." As Knights of Columbus we should all be willing to take this stand as well.

This conference comes months after the administration spearheaded a coalition of countries to oppose the anti-life and anti-family agenda at the UN summit marking the 25th anniversary of the International Conference on Population and Development (ICPD) in Cairo. That summit took place in Nairobi in November. Pro-lifers were dismayed that the proceedings were rigged to exclude pro-life voices. But the United States wasn't having any of it. In a statement with ten other countries, the U.S. affirmed that there is "no international right to abortion" and registered their protest against the use of "ambiguous" language such as "sexual and reproductive health and rights" in the summit's documents

You probably didn't hear a whole lot about the heroic pro-life efforts at the UN summit, or the administration's Trump recent pro-life **conference.** There's a simple reason for this: most people (including the media) don't pay very close attention to international politics. Up to a point, this is understandable. It's challenging enough to stay informed about the political goings-on in our own country, let alone the nuances of what's happening in the conference rooms of international bodies like the United Nations. And yet, the most-informed pro-life leaders (including, it's worth mentioning, St. John Paul II) know that the opaque and often-tedious bureaucratic maneuvering at the UN and other international political bodies has enormous (and often enormously sinister) practical consequences.

Many anti-life and anti-family global elites have selected international bodies such as the UN as their vehicle of choice for pushing radical social change. The reasons for this are myriad. In the first place, since so few ordinary citizens pay attention to what happens at the UN, it's often possible to push through a radical agenda with minimal grassroots pushback. In the second place, it's efficient. One single change made at the international level can potentially lead to numerous changes downstream, at the national level. For instance, push through a single

document at the UN declaring that there exists a global "right to abortion" and suddenly anti-life, pro-abortion, and pro-population control politicians everywhere have the tools they need to pressure their countries to liberalize abortion laws — to get "in conformity with international standards" (often, it should be noted, with the implicit threat of losing financial aid hanging over their heads if they don't).

HHS Secretary Azar lucidly exposed the way leftists are using the UN to strong-arm sovereign nations into adopting pro-abortion laws. "If the other side's goal of making abortion an international human right becomes a reality, it will mean all countries with laws protecting the unborn will be in violation of international human rights laws, with all the consequences that could carry," he lamented.

"I am sure you are all familiar with the constant drumbeat in the halls of the United Nations and the WHO to normalize the terms 'sexual and reproductive health' and 'reproductive rights.' What reproductive rights are they talking about? In this context, it is increasingly becoming clear that some U.N. agencies and countries want this to mean unfettered access to abortion, and we cannot let this threat go unanswered."

These are astonishingly strong and encouraging words, and yet we have several states in this country, including our own, that have passed laws that allow abortion up until the moment of birth and some wish to include even after birth, when a baby survives an abortion attempt. We have policies and laws in this nation that are the most liberal and tragic in the entire world. Only a few nations have unrestricted abortion laws than we do, China being one of the few!
