#### FAITHFUL NAVIGATOR'S MESSAGE

#### Greetings Sir Knights,

Due to the extended Governor's Lockdown policy and delayed reopening of our Churches for the State of Illinois, our scheduled June Summer Social will not be able to be held. At this time I have asked to reschedule it for (the first Thursday) July 2nd. I am unable to get confirmation on scheduling the Believer's Together Center so we will play this on a day to day basis until we are able to reserve the facilities. If we cannot reschedule in July, the Summer Social will be canceled.

If we are able to reschedule our Celebrant will be our Faithful Friar, Father Duane Jack with Deacon Russ Swim assisting. A short meeting will be held to nominate and elect our new Officers afterwards and a Social will start at 6:00PM. Dinner will be held at 6:30 PM, consisting of Stuffed Pork Chops, Mashed Potatoes with Gravy, Green Bean Casserole, tossed salad with cottage cheese and fruit salads, white and wheat rolls, with Apple Crisp and Vanilla Ice Cream for Desert. Doesn't that all sound delicious!!! We need a count for this dinner, so please send me **RSVP** soon possible kofc658@gmail.com or call me at 309-593-2756, leave a voice mail if I'm not available. Cost will be \$18.00 per person. For the original June date, I only had (15) reservations, so hopefully this will improve......for those that did reserve, please renew that reservation for the July date to affirm that you will attend.

At our **February** Assembly meeting we heard from our **Uniform Committee** in regards to how do we get the Honor Guard to the New Uniform and

what we can use in the interim until we get there. The following is a summary of the committee proposal. There is no going back to the use of the Cape & Chapeaux for it is officially retired, but we can facilitate our Senior Sir Knights and still provide an Honor Guard for our official duties at Funerals, Rosaries, Chalice Presentations, Masses, and other duties by allowing the use of the Tux or Black Suite, with the **Social Baldric** and White Gloves. **I learned** at the semiannual Masters meeting (on Zoom) it is not acceptable to use any part of the new uniform with the old tux uniform, meaning no berets, or sword and service baldric. While I certainly encourage all Honor Guard members to consider buying the new uniform, we will in the interim utilize this alternate as we will still provide this important part of our Assembly Duties.

We have determined that the reduced price (\$449.00) source for the new uniform which is The Supply Room (TSR) located in Oxford, Alabama, is the *only* legitimate and authorized source for the new uniform. It is a domestic provider and you must deal directly with them in ordering the uniform and the color beret patch. The Supreme Master's Office will not accept any more order requests. I have included the web site of TSR for your convenience: https://www.kofcuniform.com their toll telephone number is 833-562-4327. But remember you will need to have it altered and you will need a white shirt that's not included in that price. TSR is submitting a white shirt and a black overcoat for approval by the Supreme Master, and will have these items available upon approval.

To facilitate the purchase of the new uniform for those willing to do so, but may not have the immediate resources, the Assembly will make a two year loan up to \$480.00 with a payback within two years and a monthly payment amount determined by the amount of the loan divided by 24 monthly payments. Our Comptroller and Purser will work together on this effort. Make your request to Comptroller Bud Phillis and he will make a voucher to our Purser to write a loan check to you and set up the repayment schedule with you.

The next scheduled 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Exemplification is in Peoria on Nov.14<sup>th</sup> at the Spalding Renewal Center. Remember, we must comply with submittal requirements and deadlines, and all funds will be forfeited if the candidate cancels.

Please know that I'm praying for each of you and your families during this very difficult time., stay safe and healthy and we will see each other again soon. God Bless!!!


Must I Really Believe in Purgatory?

There is an underlying question here that is really disturbing. The under-lying question is 'must I believe all that the Church teaches to be Catholic'? Tragically, the idea that it is valid to pick and choose what parts of the faith will be accepted or rejected has become more prevalent in the later part of the 20th century. For example, we see it in the public square demonstrated by politicians who claim to be faithful Catholics but do not accept the teachings of the Church on the dignity of life.

Faith is a decision of the will. The decision is to either believe or not to believe. Faith can also be described as belief seeking understanding. That is, we believe something is true but don't necessarily understand why. Our responsibility then becomes digging deeper into the teachings in an effort to understand. If we are to believe as Catholics, that means accepting the totality of what the Church teaches in her dogmas and doctrines. We believe those are divinely revealed.

When I entered the Church in 1970, I had problems with the dogma of purgatory. I spent a very long time studying and praying about it in order to deepen my understanding. But from the first, I had to take the position that if the Church says it is true, then it is true and I need to work on it.

Actually, Purgatory is a great relief to me now that I understand it better. We know that when we leave this life, we are going to one of two places; Heaven or Hell. Purgatory is not a third destination. It is a place of final preparation to enter Heaven and come



face to face with the Beatific Vision. Until my soul is perfected and is in the state of full holiness, I cannot enter the presence of Perfect Good and Perfect Love. Some reach that state in this life and we call them Saints. The rest of us have work to do. Some of that should be accomplished in this life but what remains will be accomplished in Purgatory. There are two things to deal with: our attachments to sin and to the things of this world that get in the way of loving God and atonement for the sins we have committed.

While we may not leave this life as Saints, we can enter Heaven as Saints thanks to Purgatory.

#### PRO-LIFE MESSAGE

Most women understandably feel some degree of guilt about having an abortion. After all, abortion is a grossly unnatural act, and people who believe in God (as most aborting women do to varying degrees) have difficulty justifying the deliberate killing of a child that they know was willed into existence by Him. But not all people believe this way.

I have a Catholic friend (not a Knight) who for years has told me that Abortion is Okay, for the baby goes directly to heaven. So do aborted babies go to heaven? In short, there is no definitive way to know. Sacred Scripture and Revelation tell us nothing about the fate of unbaptized infants. Even if they spend eternity in a place like Limbo where they are perfectly happy, to deprive them of the Beatific Vision of God would be a horrible injustice. In other words, we cannot know the disposition of these children's souls, so we must not justify killing them in a misguided attempt to "send them to a better place." Those who assert that abortion is a kindness to some children are also forgetting several other important points.

First, just because we are born into poverty or difficult family circumstances doesn't mean our

entire lives are going to be spent this way. Every one of us has the opportunity to better our circumstances — but that chance will cease to exist if we are aborted. The list of presidents, military leaders, sports heroes, multimillionaires, media personalities and movie stars who began their lives in poverty is endless. To abort a child because the mother's circumstances are difficult is the ultimate statement of despair and is an offense against hope. It is also grossly materialistic, assuming that our personal welfare or status is our highest calling in life. Of course, for those who do not believe in God and Heaven, we can invert this question. If Heaven is a fantasy, and if this life is all we have, then abortion steals everything a child is going to have, whether it is good or bad. This makes abortion a horribly cruel act, even for those who do not believe.

**Second,** even if a child never escapes poverty, he or she has the opportunity to better the lives of all of those around them. All of us are called to care for others by feeding the hungry, clothing the naked, comforting the afflicted, etc., truly the Knights principle of charity. The true measure of a person is not how much money or how many possessions they have, it is how much they care for those around them. Happiness is everyone's goal, and it comes from giving, not possessing.

**Third,** many abortions are performed for actual or *perceived* birth defects sometimes as trivial as cleft lip or palate. Unfortunately many women simply believe that handicapped children are better off dead. But we have all heard many stories about how a handicapped child has brought unexpected blessings to those parents who choose to let her live. The most common such story involves children with Down syndrome, 90% of whom are aborted. A major 2011 study of the attitudes of people with Down syndrome and their families, published in the *American Journal* 

of Medical Genetics, revealed that 99% of parents loved their DS son or daughter, 97% were proud of them, and 79% felt their outlook on life was more positive because of them. 99% of people with Down syndrome were happy with their lives, making them the happiest identifiable group of human beings in existence. 96% of their brothers and sisters said they loved their sibling with DS, and 94% said that they were proud of their brother or sister with Down syndrome. There are twenty-five willing couples waiting for every "unwanted" adoptable baby, including babies with Down syndrome.

**Finally,** the assertion that aborted unborn babies go straight to Heaven is an excellent argument for infanticide. In fact, we occasionally hear about incidents where parents have murdered their infants or toddlers and claimed that they were "sending them to a better place" so that they could escape difficult circumstances on Earth. If we can kill an unborn child to save them from a difficult life, why can't we kill a small child for the same reason? A child with a birth defect is still a child — no matter how serious his or her disability. With our limited intelligence and vision, we cannot even *begin* to perceive the intricacies of God's plans for our own lives, let alone His intentions for a child who has not even been born yet.


In summary, Christians believe that aborted children are happy after they die, whether or not they are in the presence of God. However, aborting them is not an acceptable way of getting them there faster. The Slippery Slope to Infanticide presents us with even more evil. If it is not right to "send them to a better place" when they are two or three years old, it is not right to send them there by killing them before they are born. Why is this so hard for so many to understand?




