Greetings Sir Knights,

Due to the extended *Governor's Lockdown policy & delayed reopening of our Churches for the State of Illinois*, our scheduled **June Summer Social rescheduled for July 2nd will not be able to be held**, so the event will be canceled as noted in last month's FN Message. I actually received fewer RSVP's for the July date than I did for the original June date, so I'm not sure most are comfortable yet anyway.

This Faithful Navigators Message will be the last for my two year term as your Faithful Navigator. I wish to thank all our membership, & especially our officers, for their assistance to me during this time & want you to know how honored I am to have been trusted to lead our assembly through this timeframe. I am sadden to have my term end with the restrictions that we

have been burdened with the last four months & will miss navigating our assembly, but will pass the responsibility on to a great team of new officers.

We had three candidates scheduled for the **virtual 4th Degree Exemplification on Sat June 27th** by the Southern District Master coordinated as the Mt. Vernon Exemplification. Brother Knights **Rob Huggins & his two sons, Michael & Tyler**, are by this date now knighted as **Sir Knights** & brought our total recruitment numbers this past year to seven. Congratulations to each of these fine men & welcome to our Assembly! I'm sure Grandpa George Huggins is proud of you all, as are we! Your Social Baldrics, Fourth Degree Service Pins, & Certificates will be mailed to me & presented to each of you at our August meeting.

As your new Peoria Diocesan Chapter President, I was supposed to attend the Supreme Convention scheduled for the 4th, 5th, & 6th of August, but that event is now scheduled as a *virtual event*, so I will not be traveling to Washington DC for the Annual Supreme Convention.

Since our total recruitment number has met the revised requirements (due to Covid-19) we have hopefully filed all the required forms & **qualified our Assembly for consideration as Star Assembly** for the 2019-2020 Fraternal year. I have filed our application "To be a Patriot" Awards program & the required "Civic Award" application to Supreme & our District Master. The Report of Officers Form & The Fraternal Activities Forms were filed by Faithful Comptroller Bud Phillis & our Assembly Audit Form was filed by our Faithful Purser Mike Daly. The inclusion of my Faithful Navigators Message in the Abstracts Newsletter along with the emailed copied should qualify as an Assembly Newsletter, so I'm hopeful that we will be qualified & deemed worthy of receiving the honorable award of **Star Assembly**.

At our **February** Assembly meeting we heard from our **Uniform Committee** in regards to how do we get the Honor Guard to the New Uniform & what we can use in the interim until we get there. The following is a summary of the committee proposal. There is no going back to the use of the Cape & Chapeaux for it is officially retired, but we can facilitate our Senior Sir Knights & still provide an Honor Guard for our official duties at Funerals, Rosaries, Chalice Presentations, Masses, & other duties by allowing the use of the Tux or Black Suite, with the **Social Baldric** & White Gloves. **I learned at the semiannual Masters meeting (on Zoom) it is not acceptable to use any part of the new uniform with the old tux uniform, meaning no berets, or sword & service baldric.** While I certainly encourage all Honor Guard members to consider buying the new uniform, we will in the interim utilize this alternate as we will still provide this important part of our Assembly Duties.

We have determined that the reduced price (**\$449.00**) source for the new uniform which is **The Supply Room (TSR)** located in Oxford, Alabama, is the **only** legitimate & authorized source for the new uniform. It is a domestic

provider & you must deal directly with them in ordering the uniform & the color beret patch. **The Supreme Master's Office will not accept any more order requests.** I have included the web site of **TSR** for your convenience: <https://www.kofcuniform.com> their toll free telephone number is **833-562-4327**. But remember you will need to have it altered & you will need a white shirt that's not included in that price. TSR is submitting a white shirt & a black overcoat for approval by the Supreme Master, & will have these items available upon approval.

To facilitate the purchase of the new uniform for those willing to do so, but may not have the immediate resources, the Assembly will make a two year loan up to \$480.00 with a payback within two years & a monthly payment amount determined by the amount of the loan divided by 24 monthly payments. Our Comptroller & Purser will work together on this effort. Make your request to Comptroller Bud Phillis & he will make a voucher to our Purser to write a loan check to you & set up the repayment schedule with you.

The next scheduled 4th Degree Exemplification is in Peoria on Nov.14th at the Spalding Renewal Center. *This event might be virtually conducted as well. Remember, we must comply with submittal requirements & deadlines, & all funds will be forfeited if the candidate cancels.*

Our next regularly scheduled meeting will be **August 6th**, the first Thursday of the month. Typically we would be celebrating a **Bi-State Assembly Steak Fry** with our brethren from Iowa but I will leave that scheduling up to **Faithful Navigator elect Ken Maranda** whether that date will include such event or not, or another scheduled date, should he choose to continue. It would be our turn to host such an event, but I do know that the Davenport Assemblies hold their officer installment banquet during August as well. Stay tuned to hear from our new leadership on this event.

DEACON JACK M. KETTERING

August 8, 1932 ~ June 16, 2020 (age 87)

Deacon Jack M. Kettering, 87, of Rock Island [RI], passed away Tuesday, June 16, 2020, at UnityPoint Health-Trinity, RI. A Mass of Christian Burial was held 10 a.m. Tuesday at St. Pius X Catholic Church, RI. Visitation was Tuesday at the Church from 9 a.m. until the time of the service. A rosary was recited at 8:45 a.m. Burial was in the RI National Cemetery, where military honors were conducted by the Moline American Legion Post No. 246. Due to the pandemic, no reception was held. Memorials may be made to Quad City Right to Life. Wheelan-Pressly Funeral Home & Crematory, RI, is assisting the family.



Jack was born Aug. 8, 1932, in RI, Ill. At the age of 17, he enlisted in the Army "to see the world"—and ended up celebrating his 18th birthday in a foxhole in Korea.

It was at this point in his life that Jack found the Catholic Church. Late one night, pondering the meaning of life in light of the violence seen during war, Jack met a kindly older priest who took the time to listen & speak with him. So began a love affair with the Catholic faith, which lasted for a lifetime.

Upon his return from Korea Jack finished high school & went on to attend St. Ambrose College on the GI Bill. Although he didn't complete his bachelor's degree, Jack was a lifelong learner, taking many additional courses & consuming myriad nonfiction & self-help books over the next 65 years, surely earning it.

After some consideration of monastic life, Jack married the lovely Marian Leenknecht on May 4, 1957, & they had six children together, losing two as infants. He treasured his children & was very proud of them.

Jack became a mail carrier for the U.S. Postal Service & often carried additional jobs to support his growing family.

When the Permanent Diaconate was established, Jack was called to serve the Diocese of Peoria, ordained on Nov. 18, 1979. He engaged in jail & hospital ministry, coordinated religious education programs, visited shut-ins, delivered homilies, & assisted at Mass. Jack loved giving talks for Cursillo & TEC & performing—fully costumed—as St. Francis & Don Quixote. Jack also heard many Alcoholics Anonymous "Fifth Steps" during which recovering addicts shared deeply personal reflection on past wrongs & new beginnings.

At this same time, Jack developed a passion for running & completed his first marathon at the age of 45. This was the start of another lifelong love affair: Road races, marathons & triathlons, including an invitation to the Ironman Competition.

Jack eventually retired from the Post Office & found a home at Circa 21, where he fell in love once again. The "Maintenance Supervisor" (in a

department of one), Jack was able to work while sets were built & rehearsals held—and he was responsible for all those little lights throughout the theatre. The actors' house & yard were always safe, neat & comfortable, a labor of love. Most of all, he adored & admired the actors & bootleggers. Reluctantly retiring at age 85, his heart was no longer able to give him the energy he needed.

Survivors include his wife, Marian; brother, Donald; sons, Joe (Rose), Coal Valley, Tom (Kim), Milan, & John (Don), Woodland Hills, Calif.; daughter, Jane, East Moline; eight grandchildren & six great-grandchildren (with another on the way).

Jack was preceded in death by his son & daughter, Stephen & Katherine, younger brother, Dick Kettering, parents, & granddaughter, Heather.

What is the Social Doctrine & How Important is it?

There are people inside & outside the Catholic Church who view the Social Doctrine of the Church as a recent development. Some of them see it as the most important teachings of the Church; more

important than the dogmas of the Creed. Both of these views are incorrect.

God created us in community. We were never intended to be isolated from those around us. In fact, we are expected to go out into the world & evangelize; bringing others into the faith & helping them to fall into a loving, faith relationship with God. Our faith must then interact with society. This interaction is the subject of Social Doctrine.

This is by no means a new interaction. Many date the beginning of the Social Doctrine to Pope Leo XIII's encyclical letter titled *Rerum Novarum* issued in 1891. It really dates all the way back to God giving Moses the Ten Commandments. When we examine them, the first three have to do with our relationship to God. The rest of the Commandments address how we relate to those around us.

The Social Doctrine of the Church applies our faith to society. That relationship of faith to lived life in a society has never been simple & straightforward. It has grown more complex over the thousands of years since Moses. In 1891, the Industrial Revolution was sweeping across Europe raising the level of complexity even more & prompting the Pope to address issues of capital & labor.

More documents have come out of the Vatican & from the Bishops as societal issues have multiplied & become progressively more complex. Pope Saint John Paul II directed that a Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church be created & it was published in 2004. It is a great reference to the social teachings of the Church & how they relate to the dogmas of the faith. I encourage all to refer to it when thinking about issues especially as we come up to another national election.

To the point of its importance relative to the dogmas of the faith, the Social Doctrine can never be more important. The faith informs the Social Doctrine. The faith provides the foundation on which the Social Doctrine is defined & developed. To have the Social Doctrine as the most important part of our faith would, to borrow in image used by Jesus, be like building a house on sand. When the storm comes, & it does frequently, the house would fall.

PRO-LIFE MESSAGE

A few weeks ago, in New York City, **two black pro-life women** were arrested on the sidewalk outside a **Planned Parenthood** [PP] facility. PP had called the police to report the women. When the police arrived, they ordered Bevelyn Beatty & Edmee Chavannes to disperse, saying that they were violating Mayor Bill de Blasio's social distancing orders. When they refused to leave, the women were arrested.

The night before Beatty's & Chavanne's arrest, New York City had been convulsed by yet another night of protesting, marred by widespread violence & looting. Thousands of people participated in these protests, congregating in tight spaces, often with absolutely no effort at preventing the spread of Covid-19.

Rather than pointing out the health dangers posed by these protests, however, many public health experts, media commentators, & politicians instead, defended them, often turning a blind eye to, or even justifying the violence & looting. One letter, signed by some 1,300 public health experts, argued that the national protests should be allowed to continue despite the pandemic, because they are **"vital to the national public health & to the threatened health specifically of Black people in the United States."** Now the mayor has had **"Black Lives Matter"** painted on the streets of every borough in the city, much like the mayor of Washington DC did leading up to the White House. **They should have painted it on the streets in front of every PP Abortion Clinic, if they really mean it!!!**

Ending racism most certainly is among the most pressing social issues in the world. Furthermore, what happened to George Floyd is among the most despicable things we have ever seen. In the video footage of his death, Floyd's basic human dignity is denied, the officer kneeling on his neck seemingly oblivious to Floyd's humanity, blatantly ignoring his intrinsic worth as a human being.

We may certainly hope & pray that the protests will, in the long term, result in lives saved, & secure greater justice for minorities (for all people). However, in the short term, all we know for certain is that at least dozens of additional people have been killed, including at least three policemen & many times this injured, including over (800) policemen & enormous property damage caused, often – in a sad irony – targeting black business owners. We will also soon know whether the protests have caused a spike in Covid-19 cases – which seems highly likely, given the size of the crowds.

Meanwhile, it is entirely possible that Beatty & Chavannes **would have saved human lives from a premature death *that very day*. It happens all the time. Untold thousands of babies have narrowly escaped abortion, only because their mothers were met at the doors of the abortion clinic by some dedicated pro-life activist who showed them another way.**

And yet, even as crowds of protesters stormed the city with impunity, two women on an empty sidewalk were deemed so serious a public health threat that they were arrested. Such a double standard makes me angry. Understandably, it made the two women angry, too.

In comments to Fox News, Beatty & Chavannes highlighted the hypocrisy involved in their arrest, **especially in light of the fact that abortion kills more African-Americans every day than any other cause. Those babies' lives matter, too.**

"We're black women but we do not support Black Lives Matter because they're hand-in-hand with PP that kills African-American babies," Beatty told Fox News. **"They're fraudulent hypocrites...and I believe all lives matter because**

God created them. There are thousands of George Floyds that die every day in their mother's womb & it's just as unjust as when he died at the hands of that police officer."

"How is abortion essential?" she asked. "How are stores closing & we can't have Red Lobster & we can't go to church or fellowship, **but you can still go & kill a baby?"**

Someone shared a story with me about how they recently stopped to speak to a group of people participating in a protest in their city, saying, "I agree that all black lives matter, but what about babies in the womb? Do not all lives matter?" The response was "that's not the same thing."

But, it is the same thing. **Every single abortion kills a unique, living human being – a human being whose right to life is just as absolute as Floyd's, or anybody else's. And, the tragic reality is that abortion is devastating the African-American community.** In New York City, for instance, more black lives are aborted every day than are born – a far higher ratio than in any other ethnic group, **actually 65% of black babies conceived in NYC are aborted.** One reason the **Sisters of Life** were asked to stay in New York by their founder, John Cardinal O'Conner.

Nationally, abortions on black women amount to 36% of all abortions, even though black women make up just 13% of the female population. As pro-lifers have noted for years, abortion providers like PP deliberately place their clinics in minority neighborhoods. **This is a hidden violence, but a real violence nonetheless, & its effects on black Americans are incalculable. Margret Sanger, founder of PP was a racist, intent on eliminating the Negro race from America.**

How many African-American mothers – indeed mothers of all races – have been psychologically & physically scarred by undergoing abortions; how many African-American children have been robbed of siblings; & how many African-American men have been trained to use & abuse the women in their lives, knowing that if sating their appetites should result in pregnancy, they can always push their pregnant partners to the nearest clinic?

Of course, we know, tragically, that these same realities do not impact the African-American community alone, but also affect people across other demographics & cultures of our global society. Abortion is the leading cause of death in America, more than the next three reasons for death, Heart Attacks, Strokes, & Cancer combined. It should STOP!!!
