Alfred P. Huber, Sr., 95, of Rock Island, passed away Tuesday, September 1, 2020 at home. A Private Mass of Christian Burial was held Wednesday at St. Pius X Catholic Church, Rock Island. Public Visitation was 4-6 p.m. Tuesday at Wheelan-Pressly Funeral Home and Crematory,



Rock Island. In accordance with restrictions, fifty people were allowed in the funeral home at a time and attendees needed to wear a facemask and observe social distancing. Burial with military honors was in Calvary Cemetery, Rock Island. Memorials may be made to Alleman Catholic High School.

Alfred was born October 25, 1924 in Rock Island, a son of Joseph and Pansy (Dalton) Huber. He served his country in the South Pacific as a member of the U.S Coast Guard, assigned to the U.S. Navy. He married Donna Tracey on August 17, 1946. Donna passed away in 1989 and Alfred later married Mary Mosenfelder, she survives. Alfred was the owner/operator of Huber Paint and Wallpaper for over 50 years. He then passed the business down to his son, Alfred II. Alfred was a member of the Rock Island Elks Club, where he served as a past exalted ruler. He was also a member of the American Legion and VFW. PRO-LIFE MESSAGE

A recent poll found that 62% of Americans have political views that they are afraid to express publicly because others might find them "offensive." This is up from 58% in 2017. This poll adds to a growing body of evidence confirming what many of us began to suspect years ago – **that civil discourse is breaking down**.

People, it seems, are growing ever further apart. In many cases, conversation based upon common shared principles, and a basic sense of respect for the other, is no longer possible, or even desired. Respectful conversation is instead replaced with blind ideological dogmatism, *a priori* vilification of those with whom one disagrees, and – increasingly – violence.

This **growing dearth of civility** is omnipresent on social media, where people of all ideological stripes seem to delight in hurling abuse at one another. However, it is most manifest on our streets. For months now, our screens have been filled with videos of "protesters" burning and looting. In some cases, the videos look like nothing less than civil war, with people literally shooting at one another as buildings burn in the background.

In <u>*The Day is Now Far Spent*</u> by Cardinal Robert Sarah, he states "This loss of the sense of faith is the deep root of the crisis of civilization that we are experiencing. As in the first centuries of Christianity, when the Roman Empire was collapsing, all human institutions today seem to be on the path of decadence. Relations between people, whether political, social, economic, or cultural, are becoming difficult. In losing the sense of God, we have undermined the foundation of all human civilization and opened the door to totalitarian barbarity."

You would think that the bloody history of the 20th century, especially the horrors perpetrated by the atheistic communist regimes, would have convinced us that if you expunge religion, the result is not some new flowering of reason, but more often than not the unharnessing of man's base and fallen animal nature.

Pope St. John Paul II, much like Cardinal Sarah, recognized that the fight against the culture of death, and for what he called a "civilization of love", is primarily a *spiritual* battle. At the heart of so many of the worst evils of the culture of death embryonic abortion, stem cell research, inhumane reproductive technologies with their eugenic undertones, and euthanasia and assisted suicide - is this treatment of humans as merchandise and specimens to be manipulated in a laboratory, instead of immortal beings made in the likeness of the almighty God. The inevitable result is, as Cardinal Sarah warned, the sea of vulgarity and aggression in which we are increasingly immersed.

We are seeing and experiencing what happens when Truth – as Pope St. John Paul II taught in *Veritatis Splendor* – is rejected and replaced with relativistic values and the "godlike" elevation of human freedoms. Reason is replaced with emotion, which easily shifts like the wind and is manipulated like clay. Objective truth no longer exists. People no longer hear or see. They are deaf and blind. The common good and solidarity are replaced with individual and self-consuming motivations.

Here are some excerpts from Pope Saint John Paul II's "Christifidelis Laici: On the Vocation and Mission of the Lay Faithful in the Church and the World."

"In effect the acknowledgment of the personal dignity of every human being demands *the respect*, *the defense and the promotion of the rights of the human person*. It is a question of inherent, universal and inviolable rights. No one, no individual, no group, no authority, no State, can change-let alone eliminate –them because such rights find their source in God Himself."

"The inviolability of the person which is a reflection of the absolute inviolability of God, finds its primary and fundamental expression in the *inviolability of human life*. Above all, the common outcry, which is justly made on behalf of human rights-for example, the right to health, to home, to work, to family, to culture- is false and illusory if the *right to life*, the most basic and fundamental right and the condition for all other personal rights, is not defended with maximum determination." The right to life is primary in any social and political order, and has been the key consistent teaching of the church since Apostolic times.

A priest from the Diocese of La Crosse, Wisconsin has recently made headlines with a sermon in which he declared that one cannot be Catholic and vote Democrat. Why he says, in the "2020 Democratic Party Platform" published online, and under the section entitled, "Securing Reproductive Health, Rights, and Justice", the Democratic Party endorses as a basic party principle, unlimited abortion through all nine months of pregnancy including opposition to any restrictions. The euphemism used to soften the violence or association with the killing of innocent life is "reproductive health and rights."

In addition, the Democratic Party Platform also declares, "We will address the discrimination and barriers that inhibit meaningful access to reproductive health care....." In other words, party members and leaders are committed to forcing businesses and individuals to act against their religious beliefs and consciences in providing abortion and contraception. Catholic hospitals and religious orders, such as the Little Sisters of the Poor, will be forced to cease offering health care services since they cannot violate the fifth commandment, "Thou shall not kill."

Over 61 million abortions have been committed in the USA since 1973 and the Supreme Court Decision in Roe v. Wade and counting.....we have an opportunity to slow the tide of the Culture of Death in America, so please be aware as you vote in local, state, and national elections next month, and pray for those in public office and those running for public office that they uphold the most basic right to life from conception to natural death. Will we as Knights of Columbus live out our faith, or will be choose to support the Culture of Death? That is what this election comes down to, whether you agree or not with this premise.....


What we are experiencing today is what happens when the true Good is rejected. There is no civility, but chaos and insanity. Human life has no value. Every life is threatened under this mindset.


PRAY FOR VOCATIONS
